

Dear Holton Community,

MDHHS continues to require school districts to report on COVID-19 cases. Below is this week's COVID-19 Dashboard which includes new and current school associated COVID-19 cases and the number of students and staff in quarantine. Because of the district's masking policy, multiple students were able to avoid quarantine and remain in school. Public Health - Muskegon County and MDHHS is encouraging everyone to help slow community spread at this time as hospitals are overwhelmed.



Answer the phone if the health department contacts you, as a contact tracer may be trying to reach you with important

information.



We continue to implement our Rapid Antigen Testing Program in partnership with MDHHS. This program helps us avoid outbreaks by identifying positive cases quickly. To sign up, a <u>consent form</u> must be on file. The program is completely voluntary and you can sign up and discontinue participation at any time. It is recommended that testing occurs once per week for unvaccinated students and staff. The schedule is as follows:

MDHHS is also offering an optional at home testing program. Test kits will be sent home with your child prior to the holiday break. More information about this including how to sign up was included in another letter.

We recommend taking action to help limit the spread of COVID-19 including:

- Wear a mask (covering mouth and nose) while indoors.
- Practice social distancing (maintaining a distance of 6 feet apart).
- Practice frequent handwashing (using soap for 20 seconds or hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol).
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or with the inside of your elbow and immediately wash your hands.
- Stay home if you are sick; you can also get tested.
- Stay home if you have or have been exposed to COVID-19.
- Participate in our weekly Rapid Antigen Testing Program.
- Get vaccinated if you are able. Children ages 5-11 are now eligible to receive a Pfizer vaccination. The COVID-19 Vaccination Communication Handbook has information about vaccination for COVID-19. You can also contact your pediatrician's office to learn more about this vaccine.

Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the names of the individuals with COVID-19. We will continue to communicate changes and updates with you. With your participation, we can maintain a safe environment while also providing quality, undisrupted education.
