Frank Therrian graduated from Holton High School in 2002. Therrian was a phenomenal runner achieving high level success in Cross Country and Track. Therrian's commitment and passion for running continues to serve as inspiration for Holton athletes today.

Therrian's career as a Holton Cross Country runner includes two conference championships, a regional championship, three time state qualifier, and a Division IV state runner up in 2001. He is a six time all conference cross country runner and in 2000 earned Division IV all state accolades. He continues to hold the school record for the fastest 5K. In Track, Therrian was also incredibly successful. Therrian's success includes five conference championships, three regional championships, and four time state qualifier. He earned six all conference track honors and all state Division III recognition in the 1600M. Therrian continues to hold the school records in the 1600M and 3200M. Therrian's success at Holton High School led to a collegiate running career at Central Michigan University where he ran Cross Country and Track. Therrian's drive and hard work was also how he approached learning. Therrian graduated as Valedictorian in 2002.

Therrian's athletic success and impact on Holton's Cross Country and Track programs make him a worthy inductee into the Holton Athletics Hall of Fame.
