Leif Rothoff graduated from Holton High School in 1989. Rothoff was a phenomenal athlete during his time at Holton High School. Participating in football, basketball, wrestling, and baseball, Leif was an outstanding all-around athlete.

Rothoff's career as a Holton football player is impressive. As a four year football athlete, Leif was a dominating lineman. Proving his athleticism in his sophomore year on the varsity team, he was selected as Honorable Mention All-Conference. In his junior and senior year he was captain of the football team. Rothoff earned accolades including Most Valuable Lineman, All-Conference, All Area for the Muskegon Chronicle, All Area for the Grand Rapids Free Press, and Honorable Mention All-State.
